

INDICATORS DISAGGREGATED BY AGE AND SEX

Participation

Number of people who participated in programme assessment, design, implementation and monitoring

Special group established to ensure participation of marginalized groups in a non-stigmatizing manner

Men and women are chosen in a fair and representative process to represent their community in aid decisions

National System

National strategies and plans related to GBV taken into consideration in the definition of the activities

Percentage of GBV coordination meetings with national partners/stakeholders

Social & Gender Norms (*Change in knowledge, attitudes and behaviour/practices*)

Percentage of men more likely to intervene to stop gender-based violence (pre and post intervention)

Percentage of men sharing more with their partner (parenting responsibilities, resources, etc.)

Percentage of women/men who do not intend to marry their daughters before the age of 18

Percentage of young men and boys and young women and girls who participate in programmes offering gender and sexuality education

Percentage of men and women who know any of the legal rights of women

Percentage of target audience who have been exposed to communication messages on GBV

Collecting and Using data

The collection, sharing and management of quantitative information on GBV are in line with the GBV national guiding principles and international standards;

Systems for safe and ethical GBV incident data management

Number of trainings conducted for staff and implementing partners on safe/ethical data collection

Percentage of assessments, monitoring and other data collection mechanisms that include data that is disaggregated by sex and age

Health

Number or percentage of reported GBV cases referred and that received health care

Procedures aligned with international standards have been established for the care of sexual assault survivors

Number of accessible health facilities, mobile clinics in the area treating GBV

Number of health staff trained

Health actors integrated in the referral pathway

Socio-Economic Empowerment

GBV survivors have access to livelihoods and training programmes;

Changes in women and girls' access and control over resources

Inclusion of GBV risk reduction in livelihoods strategies and funding proposals

Percentage of women and adolescent girls that have access to material and/or cash-based assistance

Access to credit for women survivors of GBV

Networking with institutions and organization specialized in socio-economic empowerment

Mainstreaming:

Percentage of assessments, monitoring and other data collection mechanisms that include GBV-related questions;

Actions where GBV is mainstreamed (WASH, Education, Health...)
